3. Working Group Discussion		
<ul> <li>Nearly 900 individuals from NNGOs, INGOs, UN agencies, and the Red Cross movement applied for the AAP In-person Training. The application deadline was September 22, 2023. Given the overwhelming response and high calibre of applicants, a selection committee was formed. This five-member committee comprised representatives from Plan International Myanmar, WFP, OCHA, and UNHCR. Due to limited training seats (30 per batch), the committee carefully balanced gender and organizational representation in the selection process. Consequently, 15 participants from CBOs and CSOs, 10 from NNGOs, 3 from INGOs, 1 from the Red Cross, and 1 from the UN were selected for each batch.</li> <li>The first In-person training batch, using an advanced approach, was successfully held in Yangon from October 18th to 20th. Participants hailed from Kayin, Tanintharyi, and Mon Regions. Training facilitators from diverse sectors, including PSEA Networks, UNHCR, MRCS, UN Women, UNOPS, and Plan International Myanmar, delivered the training, both in-person and virtually. A training review meeting will be held within the coming week to further enhance future training sessions.</li> <li>The second training was planned for Myitkyina from November 6<sup>th</sup> to 10<sup>th</sup>, 2023, with participant selection still in progress. The training program additionally provides valuable networking opportunities for participants.</li> </ul>		# would be done training review meeting with training facilitators

The survey will focus on assessing the functioning of CFM mechanisms, the integration of PSEA (Protection Against Sexual Exploitation and Abuse) into reporting procedures, and the overall presence of CFM across Myanmar. However, the survey will not collect sensitive information.

 The survey is currently being finalized and is designed to be short and concise, ensuring a quick completion time. ## **AAP Online Course**

• Previously, the AAP Self-paced Online Course accepted 40 participants per month. However, with its recent expansion, the course can now accommodate up to 500 participants monthly. Over the next few months, the course will be focused on enhancing the quality, increasing accessibility for a wider audience, and creating a shorter version. Recognizing that some individuals previously expressed interest but couldn't complete the entire course, it will also be reviewing the content to ensure it's more suitable and accessible for a broader range of learners. OCHA has also invited volunteers with relevant online course design experience and an interest in participating in the review process.

## 4. Updates from Members

- AAP staff from DRC, at the invitation of OCHA, delivered the AAP training to CSO representatives in Bago (Northwest Region) utilizing the training curriculum available on the OCHA AAP page in MIMU. While observing the training, it became evident that, despite understanding the importance of community communication, the frontline participating CSOs face challenges in prioritizing this due to travel restrictions and the need for a low-profile approach in the midst of ongoing security concerns.
- MRCS has established community feedback mechanisms in the MOCHA response areas of Rakhine and Magway states. These mechanisms, which include providing phone numbers to project participants for the cash assistance process, have gathered valuable feedback. Notably, MRCS received 103 responses from Rakhine State, primarily focusing on correcting wrong/duplicate names, incorrect ID card numbers, and inquiries about non-selection for assistance. While initially deployed in these two regions, MRCS plans to expand the feedback mechanisms to other areas based on their

success.

## **AOB**

- WFP proposed that the AAP/CE Working Group collaborate on designing the AAP Course for Food Security generic training next year.
- The Child Protection Sub National Coordinator from the Southeast Region voiced concerns about various agencies independently providing AAP training to partners with varying approaches. They requested the development of an AAP training package to ensure quality and consistency across organizations. This package, delivered online cluster-by-cluster, could then be cascaded to all humanitarian actors by trained individuals. Regular assessments could determine training providers and identify those requiring AAP training.
- OCHA clarified that resources from different sources are available within the MIMU for partner organizations to reference when designing their AAP training courses.
