Rakhine Accountability Quality Assurance WG/ WASH Cluster: WASH Cluster briefly
updated on AQAWG that they have held 5 meetings that focused on establishing an
effective working group in Rakhine to provide advice on monitoring and responses,
implementing and ensuring accountability and quality responses based on the
experience. During the meetings, the group also discussed and revised the indicators.
In November meeting, the members focused on the aspects of people-centered
programming. The next step is to use the new indicators in the monitoring activities.

The following updates on workstreams were provided:

AAP self-paced online course: The self-paced online course launched by AAP/CE WG started from August 2022 and has already enrolled up to 150 participants so far. Out of 150 participants, there are 45 completed learners and 27 learners in progress which showed that half of the learners were not able to complete the course due to their tight work schedules and insufficient allocation of time. OCHA suggested to consider having another channel of communication with the learners and adjusting the learning time to improve the rate of completion. The meeting participants were encouraged to provide suggestions and inputs on that matter.

Update on resource mobilization: Co-chair updated that the working group submitted the action plans/proposal of the group towards MHF for the first standard allocation via online. If the proposal is granted, the working group will be responsible of the coordination on national and sub-national level.

MHF Standard Allocation: OCHA updated that MHF first standard allocation for 2022 includes a national-level component for AAP and MSNA. Some partners have provided their proposals for either AAP or MSNA. On AAP fund, AAP/CE WG also provided the guidance on strengthening the AAP capacity to the coordination and information management as well as on the activities focusing on building sustainability on AAP within clusters, sectors and working groups. It also includes building the platform for voices of the community. In order to review the proposal on AAP/MSNA, the strategic and technical review committee that will include each representative from INGO, NGO, UN agency, cluster coordinator will be formed. The committee will review the proposals using the MHF's score card. OCHA requested the interested members of the group to reach out.

4. Update on AAP Focus Group Discussion

OCHA briefly updated that the final call for AAP inputs on HNO was done last week. AAP FGD was conducted through support from partners. OCHA thanked the partners for inputs on HNO and support for AAP FGD. OCHA introduced the know colleague and requested for an update on FDG results.

5. Presentation on FGD results (KNWO)

Karenni Women Organization (KNOW) presented the results of FGD conducted in Karen State.
