

1. As one of the ODA (Official Development Assistance) schemes of the Japanese Government, GGP supports small-scale projects directly benefiting the grassroots level as well as contributing to the socio-economic development of developing countries.

2. Under the GGP scheme, the Government of Japan has provided communal infrastructure which has a tangible impact of development on Myanmar grassroots people such as schools, roads, bridges, health centers (RHC and Sub RHC), community centers, medical equipment for hospitals, WASH facilities and training centers since 1993, particularly in rural and remote areas.

3. GGP do not provide soft components such as training, workshops, livelihood, emergency, and rehabilitation projects.

4. Project application can be submitted for the entire calendar year. The grant is given directly to the Grassroots Community Committee or recipient organizations (LNGOs or INGOs).

5. The grant only covers the direct costs of infrastructure construction or equipment, as well as design and audit fees. It excludes management and other expenses.

6. The committee, LNGOs, or INGOs must have at least three years of relevant experience. They must have a proper plan and budget in place for future activities or maintenance. They must be currently registered. LNGOs or INGOs that meet all of the above criteria are eligible to apply for the GGP grant.
