### MEDICAL OFFICERS – 1 POSITIONS (SAGAING- 1 position) Re-advertising

The Alliance Myanmar (MAHAMATE Health Care Organization) is a local non-governmental organization (NGO) that supports communities to play a full and effective role in the response to HIV/ AIDS. The Alliance Myanmar mobilizes, builds capacity and provides technical support and grants to civil society organizations such as NGOs, CBOs and Networks to implement effective sustainable community led HIV prevention, care & treatment activities and to promote human rights for key populations. Alliance Myanmar also implements MNCH and SRHR program in Kachin and Southern Shan State as a lead of a Consortium providing integrated Maternal, Newborn and Child Health and Sexual & Reproductive Health & Rights services to conflict affected hard to reach communities.

Following the devastating earthquake in the **Sagaing and Mandalay regions**, **Alliance Myanmar (AM)** will implement an emergency response program to address critical health needs. The intervention will deploy **Outreach Teams** to deliver **primary healthcare through mobile clinics**, provide basic treatments with **essential medicines**, and conduct **awareness sessions** to promote the health status. Additionally, the project will provide **emergency referral support for EMOC (Emergency Maternal Obstetric Care), ECC (Emergency Child Care), Trauma Care, and MHPSS referral** to the nearest functional healthcare facilities.

The response will be **directly implemented by AM** in **targeted urban/peri-urban areas of Mandalay (Amarapura, Chanmyathazi townships) and Sagaing (Minkun Township)**. This initiative aims to **enhance access to lifesaving care** and prioritize support for **vulnerable groups**, including pregnant women, children under five, and the elderly, in alignment with the **6-month response plan (July—December 2025)**.

### PURPOSE OF JOB

Alliance Myanmar (AM) is seeking a qualified **Medical Officer** to join its emergency response team following the devastating earthquake in the Sagaing and Mandalay regions. The Medical Officer will play a critical role in delivering primary healthcare services, and providing emergency medical support to affected populations, with a focus on vulnerable groups, including women, children, and the elderly.

## RESPONSIBILITIES

### 1. Clinical Care:

- Provide **primary healthcare services** through mobile clinics in earthquake-affected areas (3 days- 4 days per week)
- Diagnose and treat common illnesses in alignment with national protocols.
- Ensure proper **triage, emergency care, and referrals** for EMOC (Emergency Maternal Obstetric Care), ECC (Emergency Child Care), trauma, and MHPSS referral cases and closely worked with project assistants for cash supports.

### 2. Health Promotion & Outreach:

- Train outreach workers to conduct **community awareness sessions** on Communicable Diseases, Non-Communicable Diseases, RMNCH, and SRHR.
- Collaborate with local health authorities, CBOs, and other stakeholders for coordinated response efforts.

### 3. Stakeholder coordination

- Attend relevant stakeholder meetings to represent organization as needed
- Establish networking with relevant local stakeholders for smooth implementation
- Lead advocacy meetings: formal and informal for project under guidance of Yangon team

### 4. Team Coordination & Reporting:

- Supervise **nurses, project assistance and volunteers** in mobile outreach teams.
- Lead and hold monthly team meetings and encourage all team members to participate in meetings
- Ensure accurate **patient record-keeping** and timely reporting of monthly activity reports.

### 5. Logistics & Compliance:

- Monitor **medical supply stocks** and request replenishments as needed.
- Adhere to **ethical medical practices** and AM's operational guidelines.

## QUALIFICATION

- **Medical degree (MBBS or equivalent)** with a valid license to practice in Myanmar.
- Minimum **2 years of experience** in clinical care, preferably in **emergency or outreach settings**.
- Training or experience in **emergency maternal/child health (EMOC/ECC)** is an asset.
- Experience working with **mobile health teams** and vulnerable populations (IDPs, rural communities).
- Strong communication skills in **Burmese**; basic English is desirable.
- Ability to work under pressure in **remote and resource-limited environments**.
- **Local enthusiastic residents of Sagaing regions are strongly encouraged to apply.**
