This position is based in Rakhine State, 70% travel to implementation areas.

Main purpose of the role

The Health Project Officer facilitates the development and implementation of the integrated MNCH project by effectively coordinating with township stakeholders, including the Township Health Department, other implementing agencies, community-based organizations, and a community-based volunteer network.

Key Responsibilities

Accountability and Complexity

- Collaborate with Basic Health Staff (BHS), Township Health Department, Rural Health Centers, and sub-Rural Health Centers to implement integrated MNCH activities
- Primary responsible for the management of community-based health workers and peer educators and community-based groups, ensuring community driven lifesaving MNCH activities.
- Regularly map and update health facilities and health volunteers.
- Collect and map health-related indicators and promote awareness of feedback mechanisms among healthcare providers and the community.
- Support the Field Health Coordinator in developing integrated MNCH project implementation plans with clear timelines and targets.
- Facilitate coordination meetings, advocacy meetings, and awareness sessions at the community level.
- Assist in training BHS and CBHWs/PE network at the township level and in capacity-building training for CBOs/CSOs and local organizations.
- Coordinate with key community-level stakeholders from various community-based organizations for participatory project design and implementation.
- Participate in situational analysis and other M&E activities as necessary, under the guidance of the Field Health Coordinator and MEL team.
- Regularly collect and compile project data to submit to the Field Health Coordinator, including case studies, success stories, and focus group discussions.
- Cross-check data and feedback with the M&E team (e.g., referral reports, PIP, HIMS).

Responsible for financial accountability of project cash usage in line with RI policies and procedure

Health Project Management

- Provide support to the Field Health Coordinator to each integrated MNCH project implementation with appropriate timelines and targets
- Awareness on feedback mechanism of health care providers, health services, and also from the community and explain to the respective person and report back to the Field Health Coordinator.
- Supervision on joint activities implementation with the Township Health Department.
- Facilitate coordination meetings, advocacy meetings, and awareness-raising sessions at the community level as required
- Participate in data collection, proposal developments
- Facilitate training for BHS and CBHW/PE/ Community support groups conducted at the Township level as required.
- Facilitate training for Capacity building Training to CBO/CSO and local organizations
- Mapping of health facilities and health volunteers and updating on a regular basis.
- Mapping and data collection of health-related indicators.
- Coordinate with key community-level stakeholders from different community-based organizations to ensure participatory project design and implementation.

Partner Support

- Responsible for close collaboration and coordination with partners for the implantation of the project
- Conducted meetings with partners in the targeted area as required
- Technical support to partners in regular schedule basic
- Working closely with the Field Health Coordinator on partner approach sustainability planning of the project
- Mapping of partners' service coverage area and updating on monthly basic

Data collection and reporting

- Assist the Field Health Coordinator to prepare project teams weekly and monthly work plans
- Participate in conducting situational analysis and other M&E activities as necessary under the guidance of the Field Health Coordinator and MEL team.
- Collect and compile project data regularly to submit to the Field Health Coordinator, including case studies, success stories, and focus group discussions.
- Cross-checking data and feedback with the M&E team (eg referral report, PIP, HIMS, and others
 according to reporting guidelines)
- Provide support to the CBHWs by closely coordination with roving pharmacist and respective logistics to regularly update on inventory of medical and non-medical items supported by the project.

General Tasks

- Take part in program meetings, program reviews, and in general staff meetings.
- Adopt a non-judgmental attitude, manage patients with compassion, and maintain strict confidentiality and privacy.
- Any other relevant tasks upon special request by the line manager according to program needs as required.

Carry out other tasks as required due to the project's nature or as advised by the supervisor

You will bring the following experience and skills:

- University degree in Public Health, Community Health, Health Sciences, Nursing, or a related field.
- At least 3-5 years of experience in the successful implementation of health projects or programs.
- Experience working in a similar position, preferably in an (I)NGO.
- Strong programming, management, and technical skills related to health project implementation. Experience in conducting training and capacity-building activities.
- Proficiency in using computer software, particularly MS Word, Excel, and PowerPoint.
- Excellent analytical and problem-solving skills.
- Ability to collect, analyze, and interpret data to inform project decisions.
- Strong written and verbal communication skills in both the local language and English.
- Ability to produce high-quality reports and documentation.
- Interpersonal Skills: Demonstrated ability to work effectively with diverse teams and stakeholders.
- Strong leadership and team management skills.
- Ability to work under stressful conditions and in challenging environments.
- Commitment: Willingness to travel frequently to project sites, including remote and hard-to-reach areas.
- Understanding and commitment to the principles of humanitarian work, including the "Do No Harm" approach.

Desirable Criteria

- Experience working with Technical Agencies and a good knowledge of health systems and programs.
- Previous experience in emergency response or health system strengthening in Rakhine context
- Familiarity with mobile data collection tools and methodologies.
- Strong organizational skills and attention to detail.
- Ability to work independently and take initiative.
- Flexibility and adaptability to changing project needs and priorities.
