A. Background

Plan International is an international child and youth development organization dedicated to promote the realization of children and young people's rights, especially girl's rights, in both development and humanitarian settings. Plan International in Myanmar is supporting a broad spectrum of initiatives designed to support integrated child development and youth empowerment outcomes that are strategically aligned with the national government's priorities. Sectors of focus include: Early Childhood Care and Development (ECCD), Education in Emergencies, Maternal, New-born and Child Health and Nutrition (MNCHN), Water, Sanitation and Hygiene (WASH), Resilience and Disaster Risk Reduction (DRR), Child Protection, Adolescent Development, Youth Economic Empowerment, Youth Led Peace Building and Social Cohesion, Sexual Reproductive Health and Rights (SRHR), and NonCommunicable Diseases (NCDs) Prevention among young people. Nyaung U Program Unit is one of first sponsorship office of Plan International Myanmar and it was set up from 2015 April.

B. Objective

Health & Nutrition project had provided nutrition services to the pregnant women, lactating mothers and children under 5 in the 55 targeted villages since 2019 through mobile clinics. The villages covered was expanded to 105 villages in 2022 and then to 110 villages in 2024. The project aimed to improve health and nutritional status of mothers and children under 5 in 110 targeted villages by increasing knowledge, attitudes and practices of community on infant and young child feeding through mother support groups, increasing accessing and utilizing nutritious foods through home gardens, community gardens, community workshop cooking demonstrations and social protection measures such as maternal cash transfer.

To ensure that targeted communities have increased access to nutritious and diverse foods, the project is aiming to promote home gardening activities such as seeds distribution, organic farming practices. In order to do so, the project is in need for a qualified agriculturist to identify suitable



nutritious seeds to plant as vegetable garden back home in Nyaung U region, to procure the seeds and conduct training to staff and communities on home or community garden.

C. Deliverables

The consultancy aims to carry out the following activities:

- ★ To recommend selection of seeds and provide standardized guidelines
- → To support advice and ideas on developing of IECs materials such asteaching aids and materials including presentations, handouts, and demonstration tools, and curriculum on home garden or community garden, and
- ★ To conduct home gardening (ToT) training to specific project staff
- → To develop follow-up assessment tool to monitor the progress and success of targeted communities' home gardens.

D. Scope of Work

The consultancy would need to carry out the mentioned activities during a month. The activities include:

- → To host a meeting or participated in meetings to provide advice on seed selections on procurement processes
- ★ To conduct in person training to project staff in Nyaung U City < duration of training dates can be confirmed after TOR clarifications and proposal was submitted>
- → To provide the training report and service completion report to the Project Focal.
