Première Urgence Internationale (PUI)

Première Urgence Internationale is a non-governmental, non-profit, non-profit and non-religious international aid organization. Our teams are committed to supporting civilian victims of marginalization and exclusion, those hit by natural disasters, wars, and economic collapses, by responding to their fundamental needs. Our aim is to provide relief to uprooted people in order to help them recover their dignity and regain self-sufficiency. Main sectors providing assistance to around 6 million people in 25 countries in Africa, Asia, Europe, Latin America, and the Middle East: Health, WASH, Food Security and Nutrition, Shelter and Economic Recovery.

PUI has been working for the people of Myanmar on health and related issues since 1984, as Aid Medical Internationale (AMI). The merger of PU and AMI in 2011 strengthened our ability to provide integrated, multi-sector approaches utilizing the combined organisations' experience resulting in more diverse programming and intervention possibilities. PUI's mandate to respond to emergencies remains a priority, while maintaining a longer-term development focus to adapt to the contextual needs of the population in Myanmar. Specifically, PUI has been running an HIV prevention activity for Key population in Yangon region for over 10 years, linked to a malnutrition prevention program. In Kayin, PUI focus on primary health care, nutrition, WASH activities. In Shan, PUI focus on SRHR activities for general population. Today, the mission consists of 7 projects.

Job Purpose

The Community Monitor will provide community-based Nutrition and MNCH (Community Case Management and Community based Newborn Care) services with the technical support of Project officers in collaboration with mobile health teams. S/he will have to supervise on community health workers (CHWs) for effective provision of the services to the community at the village level, with frequent field visits to the assigned villages of project areas.

Responsibilities

Project Implementation and Monitoring

- Participate in selecting target villages and recruiting Community Health Workers (CHWs) under the guidance of project officers.
- Supervise volunteers and enumerators for assessments and surveys and assist in updating volunteer profiles.
- Collect nutrition and MNCH data from CHWs promptly and report regularly to meet deadlines.
- Prepare monthly activity workplans on a quarterly basis and consult with project officers for revisions and updates.
- Assist and participate in planning, organizing, and conducting advocacy meetings, trainings, and workshops.



- Implement nutrition and health integrated activities at the field level.
- Assist officers in developing monthly work plans and detailed implementation plans.
- Monitor community-based volunteers/CHWs/AMWs in field activities under the guidance of project officers.

Prevention of Malnutrition, Suspected Pneumonia, and Acute Watery Diarrhea

- Distribute food packages and supplementary foods.
- Support distribution of Vitamin A, deworming treatments, and micronutrient powders for children and pregnant/lactating women.
- Lead and organize Mother-to-Mother Support Groups (MtMSGs).
- Provide health education to caregivers and mothers through MtMSG sessions.
- Emphasize nutrition, hygiene promotion, IYCF counseling, and illness awareness.
- Facilitate culinary demonstrations and competitions within MtMSGs.
- Supervise CHWs in identifying and treating pneumonia and diarrhea.

Integrated Management of Acute Malnutrition, Community Case Management, and Community-based Newborn Care (IMAM, CCM, and CBNBC)

- Collaborate with CHWs for screening and identifying malnutrition, pneumonia, and diarrhea.
- Ensure timely reporting and referral of SAM, MAM, pneumonia, and diarrhea cases.
- Support referral processes and collaborate with medical teams.
- Provide treatment and follow-ups for malnutrition, pneumonia, and diarrhea.
- Coordinate with FSL team for food basket, cash transfer, and hygiene kit distribution.

Maternal, Neonatal, and Childcare Management

- Raise MNCH awareness in communities.
- Collaborate in providing MNCH and nutrition services.
- Ensure continuity of antenatal, postnatal, neonatal, and family planning services.
- Provide antenatal care, including consultations and emergency case monitoring.
- Promote EmOC case referrals for in-facility delivery.
- Collaborate with local health staff and organizations on emergency referrals.
- Support safe deliveries and newborn care.
- Organize health education sessions for clinic patients.
- Provide EENC, IMNCI, IYCF counseling, and ECC referrals efficiently.
- · Record and manage medicine consumption and stock.

Human Resource Management and Coordination

- Facilitate training for CHWs and serve as a trainer if necessary.
- Conduct regular monitoring of CHW performance and document it is using checklists.
- Assess training needs of CHWs and provide on-the-job training as needed.
- Assist and support the team in providing training for CHWs and BHS staff.
- Share useful information and collaborate with the project's teams, including mobile clinics, FSL, and WASH teams as needed.
- Ensure good communication with community members, local authorities, and community volunteers.
- Participate in advocacy efforts with local and health authorities and stakeholders about project activities as needed.
- Coordinate regularly with project staff, including logistics, admin, finance, and MEAL staff.

Requirements:

- Any graduate or relevant qualification in Nutrition, Midwifery and MNCH
- Minimum 1 years' experience working in Nutrition, Midwifery and MNCH program and development sector/ INGOs
- Excellent interpersonal, communication presentation skills
- Ability to work effectively in social environments as a good team player
- Teamwork and team spirit with strong motivation to work for the community
- Able to work under little supervision to complete tasks in a timely manner
- Fluent in Karen and Myanmar languages required.
- Experience working in Karen context and Kayin state preferred.
