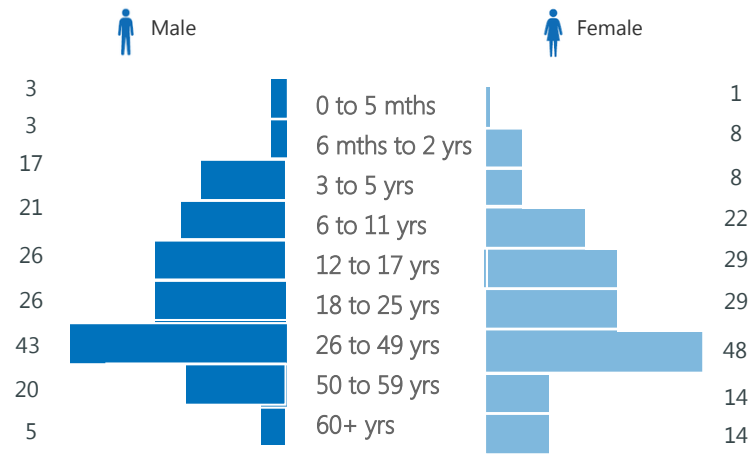

A total of 145 camps/camp like settings (out of 171 IDP locations) have been profiled. The main objective of the profile is to provide an updated overview of the situation in camps hosting IDPs, including disaggregated population estimates.
