

Cluster objectives and activities:

CO1: Affected people are assisted with emergency, temporary shelter, and emergency NFI that enhances protection, life-saving, dignity, and privacy while promoting environmentally friendly solutions, as well as increase the capacity to mitigate potential disasters.

CA1: Provision of emergency shelter assistance.

CA2: Provision of emergency NFI assistance.

CA3: Enhace the capacity to effectively respond to and mitigate potential disasters.

CO2: Affected people assisted with transitional, semi-permanent shelter support and replenishment of NFIs to enhance protection, dignity, safety, and privacy while promoting environmentally friendly solutions.

CA4: Provision of shelter construction assistance.

CA5: Provision of shelter reconstruction assistance.

CA6 Provision of shelter repair/rehabilitation.

CA7: Provision of shelter improvements for people with disability.

CA8: Replenishment of NFI assistance.

CO3: Strengthened settlement monitoring, service coordination and maintenance of camp infrastructure in line with humanitarian life-saving support.

CA9: Coordination and monitoring of multi-sector responses in IDP settlements.

CA10: Improve living conditions through site care and maintenance.

CO4: Strengthened capacity of camp management actors, communities, stakeholders and service providers at camp level on camp management and coordination, and protection mainstreaming.

CA11:Implementation of CCCM trainings.

CA12: Implementation of CCCM ToTs.

CO5: Reinforced community participation activities at settlements level.

CA13: Development of community participation activities.

CA14: Establishment/maintenance of complaint/feedback mechanism and clear referral pathway.

CO6: Cluster coordination and information management are strengthened at all levels.

CA15: Dedicated cluster coordination and information management by 12 staff members: 1 national coordinator, 4 subnational coordinators, 1 national IMO, 4 subnational IMOs, and 2 national cluster assistants.
