## **WEEKLY HIGHLIGHTS**

In the South-East, the number of internally displaced people (IDPs) increased from 833,900 last week to 842,100 this week.

In Bago Region (East), 1,000 people from Kyaukkyi and Taungoo townships were displaced within the same township due to the security situation.


In Kayah State, 1,208 people from Loikaw, Hsihseng and Pekon townships were displaced to Demoso Township, and 42 people from Hsihseng Township were displaced to Hpruso and Loikaw townships as a secondary displacement. Meanwhile, 409 IDPs from Hpruso and Loikaw townships have returned to their places of origin in Demoso Township.

In Kayin State, 4,830 people from Kyainseikgyi Township were displaced within the same Township due to intensified fighting, including artillery shelling and airstrikes. Meanwhile, 1,000 IDPs from Kawkareik Township have returned to their places of origin within the same Township.

In Shan State (South), 2,634 people from Loikaw Township were displaced to Nyaungshwe Township, while 257 people from Loikaw Township were displaced to Pekon Township as a secondary displacement due to intensified fighting, including airstrikes and shelling.

In Tanintharyi Region, 6,410 people from Dawei and Palaw townships were displaced within their respective townships due to intensified fighting, including artillery shelling. Among them, 1,850 IDPs from Palaw Township were displaced as a secondary displacement within the same Township.
