
WEEKLY HIGHLIGHTS

In the South-East, the number of IDPs increased from 1.036.600 last week to 1.038.900 this week.

In Kayin State, the conflict is escalating in the Kyondoe area, Kawkareik Township, resulting in the displacement of an estimated 172 people—136 fled to Hpa-An Township and 36 to Kawkareik Township due to continued airstrikes and indiscriminate shelling during the reporting period. Additionally, 1,747 people from Tar Le, Hlaingbwe Township, have been displaced within the same township near the Thaung Yin riverbank following the capture of a Tatmadaw base by the Ethnic Armed Organizations (EAOs).

In Mon State, 842 people from Pyin Ka Doe Kone, Kyaikto Township, have been displaced. A further 3,970 IDPs from Pyin Ka Doe Kone, Kyaikto Township, and 3,116 IDPs from Ye Thaung, Shwegyin Township, were displaced for the second time near Thein Za Yat, Kyaikto Township, due to artillery shelling and drone strikes on 2 May 2025.

In Shan State (South), 498 people from Yae Pu, Nyaungshwe Township, were displaced within the same township due to armed conflict. Separately, 230 IDPs from Taunggyi Township relocated to host communities in Ayetharyar Town. 648 IDPs from Bawlake, Demoso, and Mese townships reportedly returned to their places of origin within the same townships. Additionally, 471 IDPs from Nyaungshwe and Hopong townships returned to their place of origin in Loikaw Township.






