

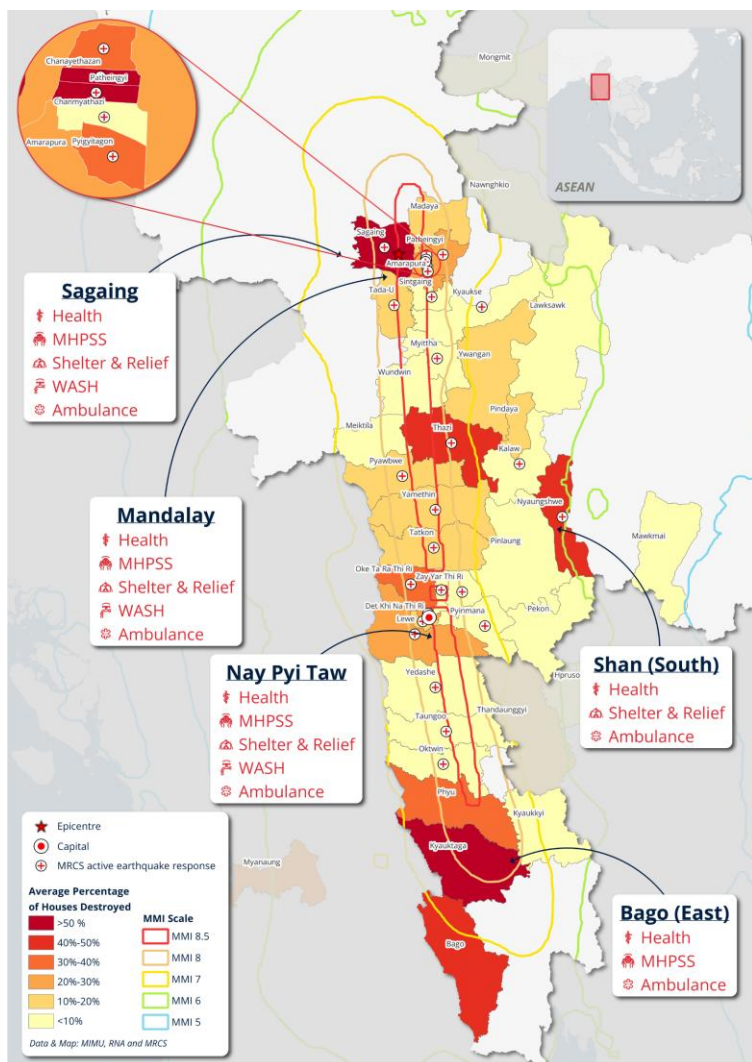

Overview of Impact on Housing and MRCS Earthquake Response



Response Highlights

Health

- Mobile Health Clinics continue providing essential primary healthcare services in Sagaing and Mandalay, reaching over 5,000 people to date.
- First Aid Awareness sessions conducted for 72 community members in Southern Shan, equipping them with basic life-saving knowledge.

Water, Sanitation & Hygiene

- Over 1 million litres of water (including 760,000 litres of safe drinking water) distributed to more than 100,000 people.
- Emergency latrines installed to support sanitation needs of 332 households currently residing in displacement camps.

Emergency Shelter & Relief

- Emergency shelter items – including family tents, shelter toolkits, and tarpaulins provided to over 20,000 people in 10 townships across Mandalay, Sagaing, Naypyidaw and southern Shan
- Complementary cash were also provided to 6,238 households to help meet immediate needs alongside the relief items.

Protection & Community Engagement

- Information desks set up at distribution sites, with feedback hotline numbers shared.
- Gender-specific hygiene kits, infant kits for children under two, and delivery kits for pregnant women distributed to address specific health and protection needs.
