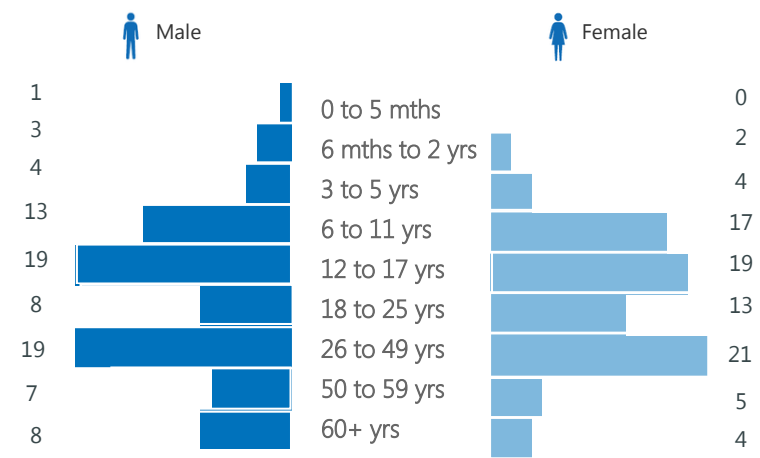

The camp profiling is biannual exercise promoted, coordinated and delivered by the Shelter/NFI/CCCM led by UNHCR. Sources of information include CCCM focal points, camp managers, camp committee members/leaders and IDP camp residents. A total of 145 camps/camp like settings (out of 171 IDP locations) have been profiled. The main objective of the profile is to provide an updated overview of the situation in camps hosting IDPs, including disaggregated population estimates.
