
Country Briefing MMR II

- In 2021 Coup led by army chief Min Aung Hlaing interrupted the democratization of the country.
- Since 2021 Nationwide state of emergency & martial law in many regions.
- Civilians in Myanmar are struggling to survive an unprecedented humanitarian crisis.
- Humanitarian needs have reached alarming levels, with an estimated 19.9 million people (more than a third of the population) in need of assistance.
- Armed conflict between the Myanmar Armed Forces (MAF) & various non-state armed groups
 - Across multiple states & regions
 - >3.5 million people estimated to be displaced



Situation Overview MMR I

- 281250mar25 local time (UTC +6:30):
 Earthquake with 7.7 magnitude (USGS) hit
 Central Myanmar
- Depth of 10.0 km (near-surface)
- Epicentre: near city of Sagaing, close to the city Mandalay
 - Mandalay 1.53 mio. citizens
 - Sagaing approx. 500.000 citizens
- City of Yangon not heavily affected
- Aftershock with magnitude 6.4, 12 minutes after initial quake.
- Other affected countries: Bangladesh, India, Laos, Thailand and China








- More than 3 million people affected
 - Several buildings collapsed, based upon scientific models, EU ERCC estimates 120.000 completely damaged houses
 - No. of deceased unclear, reported >3.000; will also increase due to contaminated water & high temperatures
 - No. of injuries unclear, reported >4.500
 - No. of missing persons unclear, reported >300

Military junta

- Declares state of emergency for six regions after quake in Myanmar → Mandalay,
 Sagaing, Magwe, Northeastern Shan, Bago, Naypyitaw
- Requested international assistance verbally towards the UN Resident Coordinator
- Not involved in any emergency or help response; disrupts emergency teams & relief supplies
- Disrupts access to areas which are not under their control
- Rejects ceasefire; continues air strikes
- Various anti-junta rebel groups (e.g. NUG & 3-Brotherhood-Alliance) announced ceasefire lasting several weeks

Situation Overview MMR III

Infrastructure


- Several buildings collapsed, based upon scientific models, EU ERCC estimates 120.000 completely damaged houses
- Damaged roads & debris obstructing humanitarian access; the only highway in MMR is impassable → transport only possible via gravel tracks & side roads
- Ava Bridge (1,1 km long) connecting Sagaing region & Mandalay region over Irrawaddy river collapsed
- Hospitals have sustained extensive damages
- Mandalay: Currently no mobile phone/internet communication
- Water & energy supplies failed in large parts of the country, including parts of Yangon region
- Increasing risks of cholera outbreaks and other health threats, due to lack of medical care and access to clean water
- Airports in Mandalay and Naypyitaw substantially damaged & not fully operational, handling large cargo proves to be challenging; Naypyitaw Airport is exclusively to aircrafts bringing humanitarian aid
- Yangon International Airport (YIA) currently operational → is experiencing congestion

Weather Forecast

Myanmar:


- Temperatures between 25 40 degrees Celcius, cloudy
- 02Apr25 & 03pr25 Mandalay: sunny, 25-38°C
- Rain expected for 06Apr2025
- March and April usually have high temperature, rarely rain

Thailand

- 02Apr25 & 03Apr25 Bangkok: Isolated thundershowers expected, 28-37°C
- A tropical depression will form 10-14 days in the future south of Bangladesh, approx. from 07apr25



- 72% chance of one or more aftershocks magnitude >5 within next week
- Likely smaller aftershocks with up to magnitude 3

 20% higher probability of liquefaction in the regions Mandalay & Naypitaw




Figure 3. Estimated areas and population exposed to liquefaction (Source: USGS)



Safety & Security MMR I

- Military coup 2021 → Martial Law in many regions; in individual cases local volunteers are arrested & conscripted into military services by the junta
- Affected area is partially controlled by Yunta and different rebel groups with frequent hostilities between these parties
- Travel warning by German Federal Foreign Office
 - German citizens should leave
 - Partial night-time curfew
 - Partial bans on public gatherings
- Conflicts between Muslims & Buddhists
- Road Yangon-Mandalay is damaged & affected by rebels → high risk to be upheld (for money)
- Radio, satcom & drones are prohibited
- MMR produces, acquires, develops antipersonnel mines → 2024 recorded highest number of annual casualties worldwide (1.003)
- Risk of asbestos contamination due to old collapsed buildings & more dust in the air



Safety & Security MMR II

- Visa regulations: e-visum available
 - Visa requirement for German citizens
 - 28 days valid for tourist visa → for teams business visa is needed
 - Visa on arrival in Yangon & Mandalay for ASEAN passholders possible
 - For arrival, an entry stamp is absolutely necessary, otherwise there is a risk of penalties on departure
 - So far no exemption from import duty on humanitarian goods; relief supplies still need a clearance
 → can take up to months
 - Border crossings reported open (still possibility that borders can be closed without notice)
 - Mae Sai (THA) Tachileik (MMR)
 - Mae Sot (THA) Myawaddy (MMR)
 - Phu Nam Ron (THA) Htee Kee (MMR)
 - Ranong (THA) Kawthaung (MMR)
 - Three Pagodas Pass (THA) Payathonzu (MMR)
- As of 31mar25 no visas are issued for Western teams, entering the country proves to be difficult for EU
 members and partner organisations
- 1apr25: MMR will no longer accept international USAR teams, EMT & other incoming personnel
- No compulsory vaccinations are required for direct entry from Germany; the following are recommended:
 Cholera, Japanese encephalitis, Hep. A+B, Typhus, Yellow fever, Diphteria, Malaria



International Response MMR I

28mar25: Military junta requested international assistance verbally towards the UN Resident Coordinator & to all embassies in MMR 30mar25: UN RC MMR requested support from DG ECHO for USAR, EMT, health, shelter, food, WASH supplies & services

United Nations

- State Administration Council has requested support from the international system.
 - Alert for the INSARAG network to deploy
 - National teams are monitoring
 - UN & humanitarian partners are mobilizing to support emergency response efforts & stand ready to assist
- OCHA puts together an UNDAC team (30mar25 status M3a), planned travel via Bangkok, plan to deploy in Mandalay; UNDAC-team is being deployed to support OCHA MMR office; still awaiting visa in Bangkok (2apr25)
- WFP assessing the needs
- IHP monitors the situation & has contacted partners, so far no request from UN OCHA
- UN Emergency Relief Coordinator allocated initial US\$ 5 million for life-saving assistance
- WHO classified crisis as a Grade 3 emergency (highest level); dispatched 3 tons of trauma kits & medical supplies

Germany

- Johanniter International currently on assessment in Mandalay
- Malteser International deployed 2 experts
- @fire deployed as an NGO to support OCHA in order to operate an RDC, deployed at Yangon International Airport; are unable to perform their task (RDC) due to lack of approval (2apr25)
- Germany's Relief Coalition "Aktion Deutschland Hilft" launched an appeal for donations
- Humedica (advanced medical help) deployed as NGO with an Assessment Team to Thailand

USA

 President Trump announced the examination of help

European Union

- UCPM has been activated twice on Sunday; as well as Copernicus and ReliefEU to establish an airbridge via Kuala Lumpur and/or Dubai
- ERCC is looking to deploy a EUCP Team to Thailand for 2 weeks, exact date of Dispatch currently unclear and depending on obtaining visas for team members
- Ongoing Request of Assistance (RfA) for relief supplies, including shelter, food and medical equipment
- DG ECHO pledged 2,5 million € for initial emergency aid
- According to official authorities no additional (western) USAR or EMT teams are needed, focus instead on relief items and in kind assistance; financially supporting local acting NGOs
- A logistics hub with locations in Kuala Lumpur and Bangkok is being established to consolidate procurement and distribution of relief items; purchasing goods as locally as possible
- Logistics Team will arrive in Bangkok 3apr25, some personnel will support in Kuala Lumpur
- EU Commission has activated humanitarian air lift for NGO; first deliveries planned
- WHO contacted ERCC → medical equipment especially portable medical devices (e.g. X-ray, CT) are needed
- So far, no reliable recipients for relief supplies have been identified; EU Liaison Officer in Bangkok



International Response MMR III

28mar25: Military junta requested international assistance verbally towards the UN Resident Coordinator & to all embassies in MMR 30mar25: UN RC MMR requested support from DG ECHO for USAR, EMT, health, shelter, food, WASH supplies & services

Asian Teams

- No visa required for Asian teams (except Malaysia)
- ASEAN: AHA-team arrived on Saturday 29mar25
- Direct deployment to Yangon/MMR
- According to VOSOCC multiple teams from China, Russia, India, Malaysia, Singapore and Turkey are in the country
- China: China Search & Rescue teams (> 144 personnel); 31mar25 arrived 12.000 tents, 8.000 blankets, >400.000 first aid kits; pledged 100 million Yuan (USD 13.8 million)
- Russia: Central Airmobile Rescue Team of EMERCON Russia (IEC Heavy USAR) arrived (116 personnel, 4 dogs, relief supplies)
- India: donated 15,3 t relief materials (29mar25); medical team & USAR will move to Mandalay (118 personnel)
- Malaysia: Arrived on 30mar25 (IEC Heavy USAR)
- Singapore: 30mar25 deployed in Naypyidaw (IEC Heavy USAR), after Search & Rescue operation one person rescued alive
- Thailand: 30mar25 arrived Royal Thai Armed Forces (55 personnel) for emergency medical care
- Indonesia: 1apr25 will deploying Indonesia Search & Rescue; 3apr25 will deploying EMT & emergency relief supplies
- UAE: 31mar25 deployed USAR team (IEC Heavy USAR, 83 personnel, 7 dogs)
- Lao PDR, Vietnam & Philippines indicated deployment of USAR, EMT & relief resources

THW Response

- THW is monitoring the situation
- As the situation evolves THW is examining the possibility to deploy appropriate capacities (e.g. water purification, experts for EU/UN, relief items).
- A deployment of THW is currently not immanent, taking into account the security situation and problems to access the affected area.
- Update 31mar25: GMLZ passed on 2 RfA, regarding relief supply and EU Experts
 - THW refrained from deploying a TAST Team or experts
 - Examination of possible relief supply items delivery (e.g. shelter, medical supply, food) is ongoing;
 - Currently no further deployment of THW experts or teams expected
- THW will send an updated SitRep in case of its potential involvement in response to the situation
