Job purpose

The ICRC **Water and Habitat Department** is looking for a **Water and Habitat Engineer** to be based in its Myitkyina office. In close cooperation with the Water and Habitat Team Leader in Myitkyina, the WatHab Engineer will be responsible for planning, organizing, implementing, and monitoring Water and Habitat projects.

Main responsibilities

- You will develop project documents (drawings, bills of quantities, contract, etc) for engineering projects using approved formats, and monitor project implementation for compliance with project documents, ICRC standards, and local building codes/standards, ensuring corrective action is taken where necessary.
- You will supervise and monitor project implementation including consultants and/or contractors working on project sites and conduct quality control of infrastructure installed by the ICRC.
- You will provide regular information to colleagues on security, stakeholder issues, and site progress.
- You will manage project purchasing on labor and materials according to the delegation's financial rules.
- You will give support to other Water and Habitat projects, tasks, and duties in other sites as necessary.
- You will train or organize training for end-users in the operation and maintenance of infrastructure installed by the ICRC.
- You will establish and keep contact with various interlocutors and clients in the project areas.
- You will liaise with the National Society (NS), Partner National Society (PNS), and Red Cross Volunteers (RCV) as needed to coordinate WatHab responses and training.
- You will assist in contributions to regular Delegation reporting.
- When required, support the WatHab field teams and other departments, including site visits or short field deployments.
- In addition, you will interpret accurately from English to the National Language and vice versa during field visits, meeting with interlocutors, and translating documents from English to the National Language and vice versa as required.

Requirements and experience

- Have a university degree in civil, structural, or hydrological/hydraulic engineering, architecture, or similar.
- At least 5 years of work experience in a similar field of activity.
- Excellent command (spoken and written) of local language(s) and English.
- Your communication skills should be excellent, and you should be fluent in written and spoken English as well as the Myanmar language.
- Knowledge of the local dialects in Kachin is an absolute asset.
- Excellent writing and summarizing skills, and good knowledge of digital tools.
- Previous experience in the humanitarian sector is a strong asset.
