Job purpose

The ICRC Water and Habitat Department is looking for a WatHab Engineer to be based in its Myitkyina office. In close cooperation with the Water and Habitat Team Leader and the Water and Habitat team in Myitkyina, the WatHab Engineer will be responsible for planning, organizing, implementing and monitoring Water and Habitat projects. The WatHab Engineer working for Myitkyina sub-delegation will cover the works in Kachin in response to increased humanitarian needs.

Main responsibilities

- Prepare proposals and project descriptions including drawing up documents (technical engineering drawings, bills of quantities, contracts, etc.) for engineering projects using approved formats; monitors project implementation for compliance with project documents, ICRC standards, and local building codes/standards, ensuring corrective action is taken where necessary.
- Supervise and monitor project implementation including consultants and/or contractors working on project sites and conducts quality control of infrastructure installed by the ICRC.
- Manage project purchasing on labour and materials according to the delegation's financial rules.
- Train or organize training for end-users in the operation and maintenance of infrastructure installed by the ICRC.
- Establish and keep contacts with various interlocutors and clients in the project areas.
- Write field trip reports and minute of workshops and meetings.
- Assist the direct supervisor in monitoring and evaluation of the projects.
- Interpret accurately from English to National language and vice versa during field visits, meetings with interlocutors, and otherwise, as required.
- Translate documents from English to National language and vice versa as required.
- Maintain regular contacts with MRCS chapters and with other interlocutors (NGO's, associations, etc.) and exchanges information as required.

Requirements and experience

- Have a university degree in in civil, structural, or hydrological/hydraulic engineering, architecture or
- 3-5 years' professional experience in a related field of activity.
- Proficient in use of drawing software if working in construction and hydraulic engineering. Communication skills should be excellent, and you should be fluent in written and spoken English as well as the Myanmar language.
- Knowledge of the local dialects in Myitkyina district is an absolute asset.
- Previous experience in the humanitarian sector is a strong asset.
