Job purpose

The ICRC Physical Rehabilitation Program (PRP) is looking for an Ortho-prosthetist to be based in its Myitkyina Sub-Delegation. Contribute to the implementation of the Physical Rehabilitation Project activities in accordance to agreed objectives and related strategies, particularly in relation to improved quality and capacity of prosthetics and orthotics (P&O) and wheelchair service provision. As a member of the physical rehabilitation multidisciplinary team, s/he contributes to the implementation of internal and international P&O standards, overall service provision standards and monitor the quality of the services provided (from registration of the service user to discharge). S/he will personally provide services to more complicated/complex cases.

Main responsibilities

- Advise on the design of the prosthetic/orthotic device including interface, suspension, and selection
 of the proper components.
- Contribute to all technical and clinical work of the Physical Rehabilitation Centre and facilitates the provision of P&O and wheelchair services.
- Formulate a range of prosthetic or orthotic designs including selection of materials, components, and additional aids.
- Perform and/or supervise fabrication of the prosthesis, orthosis, and wheelchair assembly.
- Carry out fitting, static, and dynamic alignment and, where appropriate, preliminary training and initial check-out.
- Follow-up the gait training and gait analysis of the patient under his responsibility together with the Physiotherapist.
- Perform final quality control checks together with the Physical Therapist in preparation for finishing and for delivery according to established ICRC standards.
- Plan, and develop tailored trainings for the partners involved in the repairmen network in Kachin State.
- Participate in Beneficiary feedback and technical assessment (BF & TA) and able to implement recommendations based on the outcomes.
- Contribute to monitoring the PRC's stock consumption and actively participate in the planning and ordering of workshop equipment, materials, and tools.
- Fill all support documents related to machine and tools maintenance, repair, and replacement.

Requirements and experience

- Degree or Diploma in Orthopaedic Technology.
- Additional relevant degrees (e.g. pedorthist) are an asset.
- Minimum 2 years working experience as an ortho-prosthetist, with at least 2 years with a wide scope of practice.
- Strong commitment and motivation for humanitarian work and work with People with Disabilities.
- Essential computer literacy (Word, Excel, Internet).
- Fluency in both oral and written communication in English and Myanmar, fluency of other local languages an asset
- Fosters collaboration, creativity, positivity, and flexibility in the workplace.
- Previous ICRC experience is also a strong asset.
