Job purpose

The ICRC is looking for two Health Field Officers to integrate the Rakhine team. They will contribute to developing, implementing and monitoring ICRC health activities in the field, in cooperation with the other ICRC departments and according to ICRC humanitarian mandate and principles.

Main responsibilities

- Participates in the analysis of and reflection on the overall access to healthcare services and global health situation in Rakhine.
- Contributes to realistic project proposals in line with the Rakhine Sub Delegation's objectives and priorities.
- Facilitates and or conducts field trips to implement, monitor and evaluate the effectiveness of ICRC support, and helps communicate with the local beneficiaries/population /victims.
- Carries out logistic tasks and organizes activities with beneficiaries in the field when required.
- Coordinates with other specialized departments to strengthen access to healthcare services in Rural /Primary Health centers.
- Maintains contacts and organizes meetings with relevant interlocutors including local Health authorities.
- Supports community sensitization activities with community volunteers and other health related actors.
- Timely reports on activities and collects quarterly activity reports from community volunteers.
- Interprets accurately from English to the National language and vice versa to facilitate ICRC's activities.
- Complies, drafts and writes reports as needed, including recommendations and action plans, including minutes of workshops and meetings.
- Contributes to the analysis of the security, socio-economic, cultural and political environment relevant to the ICRC and shares relevant information with his/her superiors.

Requirements and experience

- Studies in Medicine, Nursing or other relevant health profession.
- Good knowledge of public health, community health and local health services, staff and system.
- Relevant certificate or license (You should have a valid license and be registered with either Medical or Nursing Council if you are a nurse).
- Minimum 2 years of work experiences in related field.
- Excellent communication skills; Fluent in written and spoken English as well as in local language (s)
