# The ICRC is looking for multiple MHPSS Field Officers for its Myitkyina and Yangon offices. Under the supervision and with the support of the MHPSS Delegate, the Field Officers will develop, implement, and follow up on Mental Health and Psychosocial Support (MHPSS) activities related to the ICRC's target populations in the Myitkyina Sub-Delegation and Yangon Delegation. These activities focus on increasing the capacity of and supporting staff who address the MHPSS needs of weapon-wounded patients and individuals using the Physical Rehabilitation Centres (Myitkyina Physical Rehabilitation Centre -MPRC- and Hpa-An Orthopedic Rehabilitation Centre - HORC) and support communities to identify people with mental health needs and provide MHPSS activities assuring the continuum of care. Depending on the identified needs in their area of assignment, the MHPSS Field Officers may also

### Main responsibilities

- Provide adequate support and training on MHPSS to key actors and/or partners (first aid responders, community leaders, health care professionals, Myanmar Red Cross Society volunteers of local branches, etc.) and adapt it to changing context dynamics (e.g. online, face to face sessions, emergency, etc.).
- Facilitate awareness raising sessions to different people affected by violence and key actors/professionals.
- Assess the MHPSS needs of individuals and groups affected by violence due to the conflict.
- Provide direct psychological and/or psychosocial support, when needed
- Create and maintains direct links with the MHPSS programs' service users.
- Work in close contact with other ICRC departments to provide a coordinated and integrated response to the needs of our MHPSS service users, and provides the technical support to other departments, when necessary.
- Execute field tasks independently and report to the line manager.
- Provide inputs for internal project documents and external reports, if needed.
- Contribute to the design of new MHPSS projects, trainings, etc.
- Responsible for her/his own working advances and should be familiar with the administration and logistic procedures.
- Responsible for the follow up of payments done to service users and/or external partners.

### Requirements and experience

- University degree in psychology (minimum 3 years' university study) or psychiatry (minimum 5 years' university study).
- Minimum of 2 years' experience in MHPSS programmes.
- Minimum of 3 to 5 years of overall professional experience.
- Post-graduate trainings in Clinical Psychology (e.g. Master's in clinical psychology, Diploma in Cognitive and Behavioral Therapy, Trauma-focused CBT, Acceptance and Commitment Therapy, etc.).
- Counseling experience.
- Experience working in clinical settings.
- Experience working with community groups.
- Humanitarian experience is an asset.
- Red Cross experience is an asset.
- Fluent command of English and well as local languages (Burmese, Jinghpaw, and any other local language of Central and Southern Myanmar is an asset).
