Job purpose

The Economic Security Field Officer is a resident staff member responsible for ensuring the ICRC's response is targeted, technically sound, and relevant to the needs of affected populations. This role involves working with various teams to provide a holistic programmatic response based on beneficiaries' needs. The field officer will report technically to the Economic Security Delegate overseeing project implementation.

Main responsibilities

- Contributes to weekly and monthly activity planning in line with EcoSec Department objectives, geographical scope, and as defined by the ICRC management in terms of Field Trip Notifications.
- Contributes to analyzing the security, socioeconomic, cultural, and political environment in the area of responsibility related to the ICRC
- Contributes to analyzing strengths, weaknesses, opportunities, and threats in the area of responsibility to identify possible response options in accordance with EcoSec Department guidelines and methodologies.
- Designs or adjusts data-collection tools and reports on data quality. Analyses data and provides recommendations based on this.
- Participates in and leads field activities such as beneficiary registration, distributions, monitoring, and community meetings.
- Ensures that the monitoring of the activities is carried out according to ICRC standards and guidelines and uses EcoSec templates to provide reports and analyses.

 Ensures accountability to the affected population is incorporated into the way the projects are
- implemented and that communities are communicated on how to use the feedback and complaints
- Ensure up-to-date community engagement and accountability files are maintained with required field materials from CCC and AAP. This includes respecting the code of conduct, handling complaints and feedback, and sending proper Community engagement messages to the affected
- Coordinate with the CCC focal persons to strengthen the feedback systems and improve community engagement and accountability whenever necessary.
- Maintains and manages a network of relevant interlocutors at authorities or community levels to easily follow up on the economic security context and disseminate important information about ICRC EcoSec activities in the area.
- During program implementation, ensure that affected populations have equal access to information and feedback mechanisms and participate in decision-making processes
- Ensure coordination with operating national societies (MRCS) whenever necessary.

Requirements and experience

- At least 5 years of experience in a similar field of activity.
- Bachelor's degree in economics, anthropology, agronomy, veterinary science, nutrition, public health or equivalent qualification in a related field of study (desired).
- Ability to network, represent the organization externally and dialogues with major stakeholders. Fluency in both oral and written communication in English and Myanmar.
- Fluency in one of the other local languages such as Shan.
- Excellent administrative, time management and organizational skills.
- Upholds a high sense of accountability, professionalism and confidentiality.
- Advanced computer proficiency especially in MS Office suite and good command of EcoSec specialized software, specific databases.
 Fosters collaboration, creativity, positivity, teamwork spirit and flexibility in the workplace.
 Excellent communication skills and good analytical skills with creative thinking.
