The ICRC is looking for a Health Field Officer to be based in its Mandalay office. Under the supervision of the Head of Sub Delegation, and in cooperation with the health team, the Health Field Officer seeks to strengthen links and partnership with the authorities at the Ministry of Health (MoH), partners, and other stakeholders, at the Township level and/or State/Division/Regional levels.

Main responsibilities

- Represents the Health Department in the pertinent Emergency Earthquake Forum in Mandalay.
- Coordinates the activities with all the existing health programs.
- Supports the teams and the EHD in the Emergency Earthquake Response, strategy of intervention design in coherence with the MAY Delegation strategy.
- Monitors and analyses the ICRC's support to authorities regarding Health Emergencies and C19 response, provides strategies on the way forward and contributes to adapting components of this response.
- Supports to the Health teams in the different sub-delegations, Yangon and Mandalay in Emergency Response and C19-related activities implementation.
- Deployed to the field, in collaboration with other departments as part of the Emergency Response Team.
- Contributes to the internal reporting.
- Compiles all ICRC Earthquake activities/statistics in coordination with the other health team involved in this emergency.
- Knows, applies and complies with all the administrative procedures linked to his/her work
- Establishes and maintains a network of relevant national health authorities such as the Ministry of Health (MoH), international and local stakeholders (MRCS, UN, and NGOs)

Requirements and experience

- Bachelor's degree in medicine or Nursing with a valid license
- Postgraduate master's degree/Diploma in Public Health, Tropical Medicine and/or Health Management is a strong asset,
- Experience in health aspects of humanitarian action and in Health program management from a Public Health perspective (1-year minimum).
- Fluent in English (both written and oral), speaks Burmese and any other local languages
