Terms of Reference

Introduction

Kyal Sin May is a community-based organization established in 2013, with an office located in Bogale. It is a women's organization comprising rural women, registered at the regional level for basic accounting and financial management, undertaking local development initiatives. KSM works in the fields of humanitarian assistance, nutrition and food security, agricultural production, safe migration, capacity strengthening for Women Self-Help Groups (WSHGs), and encouraging women's involvement in local governance in Bogale Township, Ayeyarwady Region. The Projects are funded by various donors, including UNFAO, LIFT, and others.

The project aims to improve the resilience of 25 small scale fishery communities and in order to enhance their livelihood resilience and promote awareness on fishery resources management link to EAF in Bogale Township, Ayeyarwady Region.

The key outputs of the project

Output (1) Institutional Capacity of SSF organizations are strengthened and developed the community action plan for sustainable fishery production and resilience to shocks.

Output (2) Increased awareness and capacity of SSF communities through Peers to Peers (P2P) learning Platform

Output (3) SSF households' knowledge of and skills in improved hygienic seafood production.

Output (4) Generate progress reports (qualitative and quantitative) of the project activities.

Objective of the Assignment

The main purpose of this consultancy is to:

- (a) To measure the level of knowledge, attitude and practices of small-scale fishers on fishery resources management link to ecosystem approach to fisheries (EAF), illegal fishing, local conservation practices, safety at sea, post-harvest practices and food hygiene.
- (b) Conduct a desk review, developed appropriate tools (questionnaire), supervised field level survey relevant to the KAP of small-scale fishers;
- (c) Train enumerators/project staffs for ensuring quality of data to be collected.

(d) Analysis the data, draft and finalize the survey report according the KSM technical supervision.

Scope of Services

The consultant will coordinate with the Project Manager of Kyal Sin May and the project team. The Consultant is expected to deliver the following outcomes:

- (1) Develop the KAP Methodology relevant to small-scale fisheries and develop appropriate tools and instruments for gathering information;
- (2) Conduct a desk review (small-scale fishery, resource management, illegal fishing, conservation, safety at sea, etc.) relevant to the KAP survey; (inception report need to be submitted)
- (3) Measure the level of knowledge, attitude and practices related to small-scale fisheries, illegal fishing, fishery resource management, and conservation;
- (4) Assess the fish processing knowledge, attitude and practices of the targeted community in terms of food safety and hygiene;
- (5) Measure the level of knowledge, attitude and practices related to Safety at Sea;
- (6) Identify knowledge gaps, cultural beliefs, or behavioral patterns and practices that create barriers to safety at sea, hygienic seafood production, community-based resource management and conservation;
- (7) Conduct KAP survey, Train data enumerators/project staffs and ensure quality of data being collected; and
- (8) Analysis the data, drafting and finalizing the survey report.

Expected Outputs and Deliverables

The Consultant is expected to deliver the following outcomes:

- (1) Developed KAP Methodology (appropriate tools and questionnaire), an action plan for survey work and submit an inception report;
- (2) Completed data collection training for enumerators and data analysis;
- (3) Developed draft survey report and consult with project technical team; and
- (4) In time submission of final report to project team and technical team.

Duration of Work and Duty Station

The contract duration will be from July to August 2024. The total working days should not exceed 15 days during the assignment period. The consultant will be based in Bogale and will carry out some visits to targeted villages within Bogale Township.

Qualifications of the Successful Individual Contractor

The successful individual contractor should have:

- (1) Relevance of education Master's degree in fishery, sociology, development studies, or other relevant fields
- (2) At least 3-year work experience in fishery and development research

- (3) Experience in KAP survey
- (4) Experience in conducting relevant surveys/assessments in the fishery sector
- (5) Experience in data analysis and reporting (minimum 2 proven examples)
- (6) Extensive experience in training delivery (minimum 3 proven examples)
- (7) Good knowledge of MS Office and data analysis software
- (8) Good written and spoken in English.

Budget and Resources Required

The consultant should clearly mention the total consultancy fee (professional fees) and logistic costs for conducting the survey in the financial proposal. KSM's project team will organize the trainees and arrange the venues, accommodations, logistics, and administration, and will also assist in conducting the trainings for enumerators.
