2. PRIMARY PURPOSE OF THE POSITION

Position Summary: Karen Ethnic Health Organization Consortium (KEHOC) is seeking a highly motivated and experienced Nurse to join our dedicated team at our Anti-Retroviral Treatment (ART) Center in Shwe Koke Ko, Myawaddy township, Karen state. This is a vital role in providing direct patient care, education, and support to individuals living with HIV. The Nurse will be responsible for providing comprehensive nursing care to patients attending the ART center. This includes patient assessment, medication administration, adherence counseling, health education, and coordination of care with other healthcare professionals to ensure patients receive holistic support and achieve optimal treatment outcomes.

3. KEY RESPONSIBILITIES:

In general, the Nurse is expected to satisfy the following responsibilities:

- Conduct initial patient assessments, including vital signs, medical history, and physical examination.
- Administer antiretroviral medications and other prescribed drugs accurately and safely, ensuring proper dosage and patient identification.
- Provide in-depth counseling on antiretroviral therapy (ART) adherence, potential side effects, drug interactions, and proper medication storage.

- Educate patients and their families on HIV prevention, transmission, and healthy living practices.
- Monitor patients for treatment response, adverse drug reactions, and opportunistic infections, reporting any concerns to the medical doctor.
- Manage patient appointments, follow-ups, and ensure continuity of care.
- Perform basic laboratory procedures such as blood collection and prepare samples for further analysis.
- Maintain accurate, complete, and confidential patient records and documentation.
- Collaborate closely with medical doctors, pharmacists, lab technicians, and counselors to ensure integrated patient care.
- Provide psychosocial support to patients, addressing their concerns and connecting them with available support services.
- Participate in health education sessions, outreach activities, and community awareness programs related to HIV/AIDS.
- Ensure compliance with national and international guidelines for HIV/AIDS care and nursing practices.
- Adhere to all organizational policies and procedures, including those related to infection control, confidentiality, and patient privacy.
- Participate in ongoing training and professional development activities.

- Excellent personal organizational skills, including time management, and the ability to meet deadlines and work under pressure.
- Fluency in Karen, Burmese, and Basic English (Karen speaking preferred).
