Primary Responsibilities

- Carry out the procurement what is a sign to do in time without violating the CPI procurement policy and procedure.
- Analyze the bid analysis, generate purchase order, monitor the progress and liaise with vendors during the entire procurement cycle; investigation and resolution of post-order problems and of progress reports on procurement matters.
- Analyze specific procurement requirements and developing related procurement strategies, procedures & plan, and all procurement related forms that is feasible to all CPI and local partners.
- Provide technical support on specifications, cost implications and logistics for safe delivery of supplies received from donors.
- Support in developing Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) for medical and stock management.
- Support in developing procurement policies, procedures and stock management guideline for CPI and partners.
- Manage the inventory and supply chain management of the assigned project/location.
- Prepare stock report for the assigned project and update procurement track and Yangon stock inventory.

Regular Responsibilities

• Update procurement data, stock inventory, documents, tracker and plan regularly by working with concerned stakeholders from respective donor representatives and CPI local partners for pharmaceuticals supplies and others items.

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- Collect quotation and information from a wide range of supplies and vendors.
- Keep all the document in file properly according to filing system.
- Attend meeting, coordination and project review meeting whenever assigned by supervisor.
- Other duties as may be assigned by Supervisor and Manager.

Partner Support

- Orient and support the Partners on stock management, and Procurement & Logistics activities to ensure compliance with donor Guidelines whenever a signed by supervisor or manager.
- Follow up and monitor Partners' procurement process as per their and donor guidelines.
- Support in developing inventory control system & maintaining minimum medical stock levels of CPI local partners.
- Monitor the drug stock management for each partner and provide technical inputs if needed.
- Carry out all duties having due regard for the health, safety of yourself and others, in accordance with CPI policies.
- Carry out the duties in a manner of promoting equity and showing due respect for all CPI's local partners by understanding their norms, culture and local context.

Capacity Building and Supporting other Staff

• Liaise with, and coaching other colleagues in all aspects of procurement and monitoring of pharmaceuticals and health commodities and other supplies for both CPI and partners.

- Support the coordination of different logistics, and procurement activities undertaken for different donor grants, to ensure that program, and partners' need are satisfactorily met.
- Contribute to the development of the project work plans and reports for any supply chain related matters.
- Coordinate with Admin team for proper Asset and Inventory process.

- Bachelor's Degree in social science or equivalent in supply chain management field or related area.
- Minimum of 3 years of experience in procurement and logistics/or its related fields is required
- Knowledge of UN/INGO rules in Logistics and procurement is preferred
- Knowledge in managing medicines and medical stocks will be an advantage
- Excellent communication skill in English and Myanmar
- Ability to travel and good team work
- Advanced knowledge of excel, as well as understanding of word-processing, and power point

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- Preferable knowledge of Logistics and procurement mainly Pharmaceuticals
- Ability to work in a multidisciplinary and multicultural environment
- Good team building & excellent interpersonal skills
- Ability to manage multiple priorities in a busy office
