# Market Price Report – Rakhine State (August 2021)

# **Mercy Corps - Market Analysis Unit**

September 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2021

As part of Mercy Corps' cash and voucher assistance programs, the MAU tracks market prices in Central and Northern Rakhine State and Chin State. This monthly report summarizes prices for goods based on data from three vendors per product per market. Data were gathered during the last week of August in Kyauktaw, Maungdaw, Minbya, Mrauk U, Paletwa, Pauktaw, Ponnagyun, Rathedaung and Sittwe Townships. Prices for March - July 2021 are also provided for comparison.

### **Highlights: August 2021**

- Most townships saw very stable prices in August, although price-changes trended slightly upward in Kyauktaw and Ponnagyun Townships and downward in Pauktaw;
- Prices for pulses rose 7-17% in three markets in August, but essential foods were otherwise very stable;
- Garlic prices rose 14-27% in four markets in August, but other vegetable prices showed wide variation with prices rising and falling in various markets;
- Prices for shrimp and fresh fish fell by 11% or more in several markets, although other meat and fish prices were stable;
- Prices for domestic brands of soap and detergent rose by 10% or more in some markets, while other hygiene products remained stable;
- Prices for NFIs were quite stable for a second straight month in August.

## I. Price Stability in August

**Essential Food Items – Prices for essential foods were stable in August, with only pulses showing minor signs of rising prices.** Prices for pulses rose 7-17% in Minbya, Mrauk U and Sittwe Townships, but they were stable elsewhere. All other essential foods were stable in August, notwithstanding a few isolated exceptions. For example, prices for cheaper rice rose in Pauktaw Township and fell in Sittwe, although retailers in these townships pointed to no underlying explanation for these changes.

**Vegetables** – **Vegetable prices rose and fell in different markets in August, although garlic prices appeared to trend upward.** Garlic prices rose 14-27% in four townships in August while holding steady elsewhere. Prices for eggplant and long bean each fell 20-60% in three townships in August, however they were mostly stable elsewhere (and sometimes rising). Onion and green chili prices shifted in August but showed no overall upward or downward trend.







Meat and Fish – Prices for fresh fish and shrimp trended downward slightly in August, although dried fish and chicken were stable. Mrauk U, Pauktaw and Sittwe Townships saw fresh fish prices fall 17-40% in August, while shrimp prices fell 11-25% (other townships were mostly stable). Prices for chicken and dried fish were very stable in August, rising or falling by just 5-11% in some markets.

**Hygiene Products – Soap and detergent prices rose in a few markets, but hygiene products were otherwise stable again in August.** Prices for domestic brands of detergent rose 10-14% in four markets, and soap prices rose 12-33% in three markets (prices were stable elsewhere). A few markets saw rising or falling prices for toothpaste and sanitary pads, but in general prices for these goods were stable as well.

Other NFIs – NFI prices were again stable in August, and with few exceptions most price changes were fairly modest. The price of mosquito nets in Kyauktaw Township rose by 40% in August and the price of towels in Maungdaw fell by 20%, but otherwise all changes in NFI prices were fairly minor. In Sittwe and Pauktaw Townships, prices for a few NFIs fell by 10-17%, but most NFIs in these markets were otherwise guite stable.










#### Charts 1-24. August Market Prices (by Category and Township)





















# Charts 25-38. Change in Price for Selected Products (March 2021 – August 2021)
