NFIs : The NFIs distribution (Tarpaulin) distributed based on RNA findings. Today we have distributed two tarpaulin sheets, 4 Ovaltine biscuits, 5 shampoo paxs, 5 ORS for each of the household. The total reached of distribution (202) HH ( M460, F 525) 985 people and (404) tarpaulins are distributed in Moe Zar, Zayar, and Poe Tan. (130) of tarpaulin is distributed to 65 HH (147 M, 174 F) 321 people from Moe Zar Ward. (136) of tarpaulin is distributed to 68 HH (171 M, 183 F) 354 people from Zayar Ward. (136) of tarpaulin is distributed to 69 HH (142 M, 168 F) 310 people from Po Tan Ward. Local contribution of food such as (202) 100 plus drink, and (540) Ovaltine biscuit, and (1010) ORS are also distributed.

## **(5) Challenges and Basic Need Items**

### **(5.1) Challenges**

- Operational Challenges: Limited road access slowing down response efforts.
- Staffing Issues: Need for additional logistics and finance personnel.
- Because of heavy rain and windy untimely, affected peoples, deployed RCVs and field staff were without safe areas
- Limitation of WASH related items available in Mandalay market
- No major challenges have been encountered in responding to the earthquake. However, affected communities continue to face limited access to drinking and domestic water, as well as insufficient access to latrines. The affected households also need kitchen sets.

### **(5.2) Mostly Requested from the Branches**

- ORS, Water Purified, Food
- Tarpaulins, Mosquito Nets, Hygiene Materials, Shelter, RCVs Safety Materials
- Health Care Services, First Aid Kits, MHPSS
- Solar panel for light

### **(5.3) Urgent Needs**

- More shelter materials to meet growing demand
- Water distribution and WASH activities especially emergency latrines
- Enhanced Camp Managements
- Generator for WASH Teams
- Urgent Need Difficulties to hiring the vehicle for the transportation of food and NFI
- 2- Security Guard for Main Water Distribution station at River bank.
- Health education sessions in camps/sites
