The ongoing efforts include:

First aid Service, Emergency medical transfers of critically injured patients to hospitals/clinics, MHPSS, RFL, Blood Donation, water and sanitating, waste management, food and cash distribution management of donations from local donor to affected communities

On April 4, the Yangon Region Red Cross (Kyauktan Branch) assisted in unloading humanitarian aid from the Indian government at Thilawa Port. These relief items were then transported to affected areas

(5) Challenges and Basic Need Items

(5.1) Challenges

- Damaged roads and debris are obstructing humanitarian access and complicating needs assessments.
- Hospitals and health facilities have sustained extensive damage
- Evacuated community are staying in open spaces (not enough shading areas and drinking water, domestic water)
- Shading places not enough under high temperature for evacuated families
- Out of electricity in Mandalay, Sagaing and Naypyitaw
- Market prices increase of basic food, water and fuel
- Staffing Issues: Need for additional logistics and finance personnel.

(5.2) Mostly Requested from the Branches

- ORS, Water Purified, Food
- Tarpaulins, Mosquito Nets, Hygiene Materials, Shelter, RCVs Safety Materials
- Health Care Services, First Aid Kits, MHPSS
- Solar panel for light and communication
- Death Body Bags

(5.3) Urgent Needs

- More shelter materials to meet growing demand.
- Enhanced security in displacement sites.
- Water distribution and WASH activities.
- Water Trucks and transport Trucks

RNA Teams Recommendations

- Cash assistance should be provided to the affected people to meet the basic needs.
- WASH intervention activities should be implemented particularly for the domestic and drinking water
- The excavator should be provided to clear the debris of the damaged buildings as some households can't afford to do it themselves.

- The condition of the underground water should be tested as the color of domestic water were changed.
