- Operational Challenges: Limited road access slowing down response efforts.
- Staffing Issues: Need for additional logistics and finance personnel.
- Because of heavy rain and windy untimely, affected peoples, deployed RCVs and field staff were without safe areas
- Limitation of WASH related items available in Mandalay market

###### (5.2) Mostly Requested from the Branches

- ORS, Water Purified, Food
- Tarpaulins, Mosquito Nets, Hygiene Materials, Shelter, RCVs Safety Materials
- Health Care Services, First Aid Kits, MHPSS
- Solar panel for light and communication
- Death Body Bags

###### (5.3) Urgent Needs

- More shelter materials to meet growing demand
- Water distribution and WASH activities especially emergency latrines
- Enhanced Camp Managements
- Generator for WASH Teams
